 - It was decided at the beginning of the academic year that the building needed to be extended due to the increasing demand for enrolment. The building extension activity at the end of the year gave 9 more classrooms, 4 Labs along with separate space for departments.
 - The overall enrolment of the students from Scheduled Caste Community was planned to be increased and it has been increased by 28%.
 - The students from Scheduled Tribe section of the society had been observed increasing by 56 % as per the action plan.
